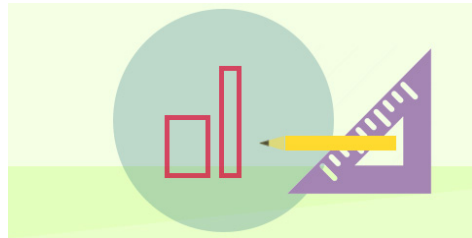
MONTHLY EVENTS

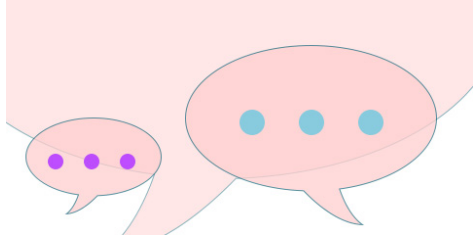
Preparing for a Successful Academic Year September 6, 2018 | Thursday

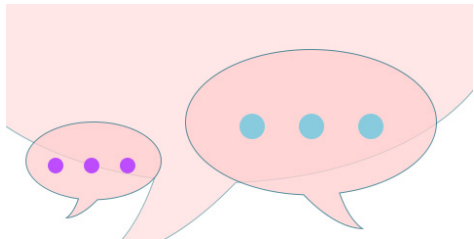

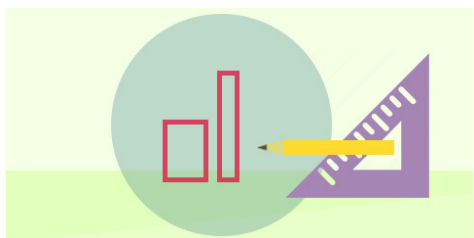

SSHRC Workshop for Doctoral Students

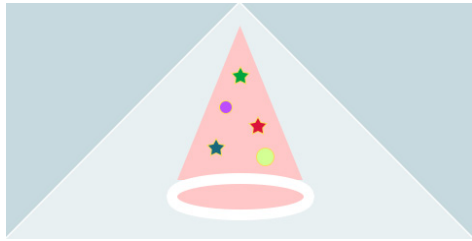

Location: Capilano Pacific Trail, North Vancouver

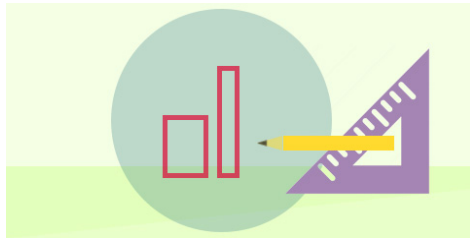

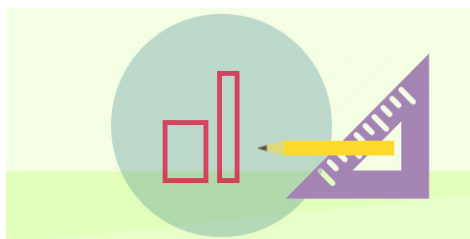
Communicating your Research: Online Workshop and Discussion September 17, 2018 | Monday
