 Educational policy research constitutes a part of social science research hence the difference between positivism and critical theory, also known as paradigm debate (Lather, 2006), has a strong influence on what paradigmatic orientation educational policy researchers might take. However in the context of educational globalization, it is also important to consider how national and international forces shape educational policy making and implementation, also known as nationalism-globalization debate (Appelant, 2005).

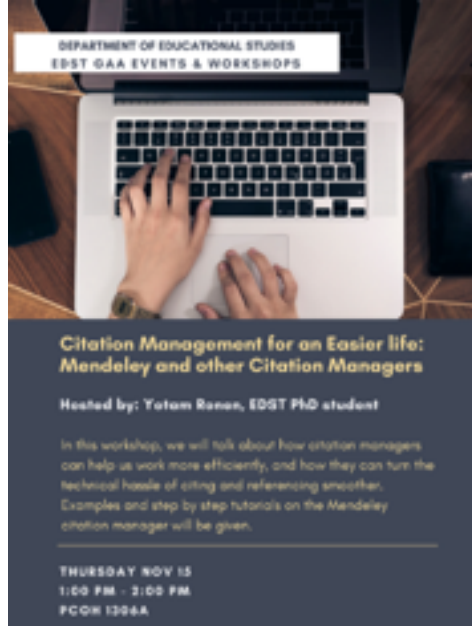
