

Submit your Proposal to EDST Research Day 2023!



We are pleased to share that the EDST Research Day will be held in-person this year on Friday, March 31.

The program committee for EDST Research Day 2023 invites proposals for individual presentations, poster sessions, roundtable, and panel sessions, and more from students and faculty members. All students are welcome - Ph.D., Ed.D., M.A., and M.Ed. The submission deadline is February 20, 2023.

This year's theme is Reimagining education for an equitable, sustainable and connected world: In the past few years, the world has undergone intense changes, the nature and pace of which are unprecedented. The disruption and uncertainty caused by the Covid-19 pandemic have highlighted that we cannot continue life as usual, and this demands a different educational response. This conference is an invitation for us to come together to rethink education for a world that is equitable, sustainable, and connected. We welcome proposals that engage the themes of social justice, environmental justice, technology and education. While these themes raise important questions, applicants should not feel limited to addressing these themes only. We, thus, also invite proposals on other education-related topics.

UBC Roundtable on Decolonization

You are invited to this special roundtable on decolonization held at Green College, Coach House. The roundtable is open to the campus community. It will take place February 1, 2023. 3pm - 4:30pm.

Description:

At the start of every formal governance meeting, UBC declares that the Vancouver campus is situated on the traditional, ancestral and unceded territory of the Musqueam people. But what does that mean? How is this acknowledgement enacted in the university's normal business operations? Academics have long called for decolonizing education and Indigenizing university processes and systems. What progress has been made at UBC? What remains to be done? This roundtable brings together scholars, practitioners, and administrators to reflect on the silences, erasures, achievements, and tasks ahead in UBC's own process of decolonization.

The panelists gathered embody a diversity of experience in work and research, a diversity of Indigenous and settler origins, and a diversity of control over decision making. Very often institutions demand a unitary voice in governance. It is likely that authentic solutions may only come when we attend to the diversity of experience and expertise and appreciate that divergent perspectives is a strength, not a weakness.
