Focus or Content

The aim of Locating Oneself in Global Learning is to provide a framework that encompasses the entire ALGC program. The bookend courses aim to assist students with: orientation to the program and strategies for success; networks and connections with peers, with a focus on important issues related to globalization and cross-cultural communication; critical reflection on self, location, and context; and integration of the diverse experiences and knowledge gathered throughout ALGC.

Part One of this course represents the beginning of the ALGC program. At the end of the program, LOGL Part Two will serve as a way to look back on what was learned and how particular experiences and content have contributed to that learning in the areas that students are most interested in.

Goals, Objectives or Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course (Part 1), students will be able to:

1. Orientate themselves to the ALGC program and articulate their goals within it
2. Explore diverse global and local conceptions of teaching and learning
3. Locate themselves in their current context through critical reflection on identity, experience, history, place and knowledge systems
4. Connect with peers on areas of interest within adult learning and global change
